1 Portfolio and Presentation

Assessment Type

Project (applied)

Task Description

During this term you have been developing a creative project as well as building your project portfolio. You will be required to utilise the information you have gathered and deliver it to the cohort of students in the form of a presentation of no more than 10 minutes in length. The 1500 word portfolio that you have created on your project will form the basis of your presentation. You may use power point, multi-media platforms, photographic images as well as audio and video recordings. It is totally up to you how you creatively package your presentation. It is also imperative that you keep a journal of events as they happen, so keeping an accurate diary of your schedule is paramount. This will also form a part of your portfolio and presentation. The more evidence you can provide of your experiences developing the project, will assist in supporting the learning you have gained from the exercise. Remember 1500 words for the portfolio.

The word count is considered from the first word of the introduction to the last word of the conclusion. It excludes the cover page, abstract, contents page, reference page and appendices. It includes in-text referencing, direct quotations and words contained within tables that are in the body of the assignment.

This assignment is worth 70% of your total grade for this unit.

did your vision meet your expectations?

did you experience any set backs or logistical problems and how did these affect the project?

what worked and what did not work?

This assignment is worth 30% of your total grade for this unit.
