While many older people are healthy and independent, others are at risk of developing chronic and complex conditions. Complexity of clinical presentations may be enhanced by individual genetic make-up and/or life experiences, while longevity increases the opportunity for exposure to disease and injury. The biophysical, pathophysiological, emotional and psychosocial capacities of older people with chronic conditions indicate they may become more vulnerable to disease, injury, and health and safety concerns as they age; therefore, require planned nursing care to address these health complexities. You will plan comprehensive health assessments and nursing care, in partnership with older people and their families, to address their complex health needs.
