# Task Description

The Scenario:

Nurse Jackie is a first year student nurse on her first clinical placement in a nursing home in her small home town. Whilst on duty she forms a close attachment to an elderly female patient Mrs Isobel James. Mrs James is 97 years old and has several co-morbidities and spends much of her time in her bed.

Nurse Jackie takes a photo with Mrs James consent and later posts the photo on her personal facebook page. She later discusses the patient's condition on facebook. The next day Mrs James gives Nurse Jackie a bottle of expensive perfume. Nurse Jackie accepts this gift and does not inform the nurse unit manager.

The next day Mrs James asks Nurse Jackie to bring her in a bottle of whisky which Nurse Jackie does. The following morning Mrs James is found unconscious and no-one can explain the patient's clinical condition.
