Working within the nursing laboratory and a variety of health care settings, you will develop knowledge and abilities in biopsychosocial assessment, planning, delivery and the evaluation of nursing care in meeting the needs of individuals and families adapting to long term alterations in health at all stages of the lifespan. You will be expected to function within the scope of practice of a nursing student in accordance with the Nursing Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA) competencies during the compulsory three (3) day residential school or timetabled internal nursing laboratories as well as 160 hours of clinical placement, 80 hours sub-acute and 80 hours community care.

The assessment criteria in the Australian Nursing Standards Assessment Tool (ANSAT) is based on the NMBA Registered Nurse Standards for Practice (2016). Further information on the assessment criteria is outlined in the ANSAT available on the Work-integrated Learning Moodle site. You are required:

1. To complete 160 hours of clinical placement.

To reflect on your practice daily, and submit a formal self- reflections at the Formative and Summative assessment points in alignment with the ANSAT.
 To complete an ANSAT assessment with your assessor at both Formative and Summative stages.

4. You are required to record your clinical hours at the end of each shift on the CQU Attendance Record. This needs to be verified/ countersigned each shift by the RN you have worked with. The log of hours will need to be uploaded into uploaded to NURS 13133 Moodle site no later than 3 days after the completion of the placement. You will also need to complete the electronic timesheet in Sonia.

If you do not meet each ANSAT criteria at a satisfactory level at Summative assessment, you will receive a fail for the Unit.

Placement Procedures and Policy

Professional practice

If you are not meeting satisfactory practice standards at any point in the placement, a meeting will be scheduled with the facilitator, yourself and the unit coordinator to discuss your progress. A support plan may be implemented to assist you in meeting ANSAT criteria satisfactorily. An unsatisfactory performance which jeopardises the safety of people in your care or that do not adhere to the NMBA Registered Nurse Standards for Practice, Code of Professional Conduct, Code of Ethics, Professional Boundaries and/or Social Media Policy criteria may result in you being removed from placement. The required hours of clinical practice must be completed in entirety and with a satisfactory ANSAT summative to be eligible for a pass grade for this Unit.
