Aim

The aim of this assessment is for you to demonstrate an understanding of clinical governance in the workplace by producing four succinct PowerPoint slides on clinical governance. The PowerPoint slides will include an overview of clinical governance, the role of nurse audit in clinical governance, the background to the nurse practice area that you have chosen to audit, the relevant National Safety and Quality Health Service Standard (NSQHSS), and the steps you have taken to initiate the audit in your workplace. Assessment One will provide the basis for Assessment Two.

Instructions

Please follow the steps below to complete your assessment task:

1. Provide an overview of clinical governance in healthcare organisations

Your overview will provide a description and explanation of clinical governance including how clinical governance impacts clinical risk and influences safety and quality in nursing practice. Your overview needs to be informed by current literature.

1. Choose a nursing practice for audit and select the relevant National Safety and Quality Health Service Standard (NSQHSS) needed to undertake the audit.

You will need to discuss your choice with your unit nursing leaders i.e., Nurse Unit Manager, Clinical Nurse Consultant, Nurse Educator, Service/Clinic Manager. They may be able to suggest nursing practices in your clinical area that require review by audit. After deciding what nursing <u>practice</u> you will audit, select the relevant National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards (2017) in which this nursing practice sits. The standards are listed below.

- Clinical Governance Standard
- Partnering with Consumers Standard
- Preventing and Controlling Healthcare-Associated Infection Standard
- Medication Safety Standard
- Comprehensive Care Standard
- Communicating for Safety Standard
- Blood Management Standard
- Recognising and Responding to Acute Deterioration Standard.
- 1. Select the relevant audit:

Work with your unit nursing leaders to decide on the most relevant audit that measures compliance of the identified nursing practice with the selected Standard.

- 1. Describe the background of the identified nursing practice that is to be audited. To do this you will need to research current literature and your local health service policies and procedures. This background should also include the clinical risks associated with the identified nursing practice.
- 1. Develop PowerPoint slides consisting of four slides maximum, addressing:
- Overview of clinical governance
- Process and systems in place to identify clinical risk in your Health Service

- A justification of the use of audit to address risk
- The nursing practice and clinical risk to be audited and associated clinical risk
- Justification of your selected relevant NSQHSS
- A rationale for auditing the selected practice and steps taken to initiate the audit

Literature and references

In this assessment use at least 5 contemporary references (<5 years) to substantiate your information. You may also use seminal scholarly literature where relevant. Suitable references include peer-reviewed journal articles as well as textbooks and credible websites. When sourcing information, consider the 5 elements of a quality reference: currency, authority, relevance, objectivity, and coverage. Grey literature sourced from the internet must be from reputable websites such as from government, university, or peak national bodies: for example, the Australian College of Nursing.

Aim

The aim of this presentation is to demonstrate your understanding of clinical audit, and the associated quality standards, as part of the quality improvement cycle. You will identify deviations from best nursing practice in your clinical area, justifying an audit of a selected nursing practice and explaining what you did with the audit findings.

Instructions

This assessment is to be undertaken in the clinical setting at your local health service. This presentation builds on Assessment One. Based on the National Safety and Quality Health Service Standard (NSQHSS) selected in Assessment One, and in collaboration with your local nursing team, undertake a clinical audit and present your findings at your local Hospital and Health Service. You are not required to repeat information from Assessment One, unless brief detail is required to give context to your presentation. You are to present the audit cycle: the steps that were undertaken to do the actual audit; the findings; and what was done about the findings.

Please follow the steps below to complete your assessment task:

- 1. Collaborate with your manager at the HHS to:
 - 1. choose an area to audit from the selected NSQHSS in Assessment 1
 - 2. determine the sample size.
- 2. Work with your unit's nursing leader to decide on the tools for data collection and timeframe.
- 3. Ensure you have the NSQHSS selected in Assessment 1 for comparison or benchmarking to achieve compliance.
- 4. Report on the audit through a five-minute oral presentation
 - i) at your local HHS if you are in a partnered program, or
 - ii) by recording yourself and submitting through Moodle.
- 5. Provide one PowerPoint with a summary of the audit data collection, findings and recommendations
 - 6. Only ONE slide is to be used
