Instructions

Reflect on your professional nursing practice and analyse how you demonstrate effective communication and role model professionalism. In your reflection, you will provide examples of your personal outputs as evidence of your professionalism and positive impact on patient outcomes. Substantiate your analysis with the current literature. Please follow the steps below to complete your assessment task:

- Step 1. Introduce your essay and the approach your reflection will take.
- Step 2. Research the current literature on nursing professionalism and effective communication to inform and substantiate your reflection.
- Step 3. Review the <u>video explaining reflective writing</u> to guide your reflection.
- Step 4. Analyse your examples of professionalism and communication.
- Step 5. Analyse how your personal outputs impact patient outcomes.
- Step 6. Substantiate your discussion using current, relevant, peer reviewed literature.
- Step 7. Conclude with a succinct summary of your essay.

Literature and references

In this assessment use at least 15 contemporary references (<7 years) to support your discussion. You may also use seminal scholarly literature where relevant. Suitable references include peer-reviewed journal articles as well as textbooks and credible websites. When sourcing information, consider the five elements of a quality reference: currency, authority, relevance, objectivity, and coverage. Grey literature sourced from the internet must be from reputable websites such as from government, university, or peak national bodies: for example, the Australian College of Nursing or the Australian Association of Social Workers.

- 7. The word count is considered from the first word of the introduction to the last word of the conclusion. The word count excludes the reference list but includes in-text references and direct quotations.
