Overview

It will enable you to refine your research proposal and proceed with the execution of your proposed research project during the final year of the Master of Project Management (CV84). You will learn how to conduct a critical literature review. Your research approach, methods and instruments of primary data collection will be determined in this unit. You will also complete ethics protocols if your intended research involves people. The final stage of the research project will be completed in Research Project 2 (PPMP20016).
