2 Written Assessment

Assessment Type

Written Assessment

Task Description

Students are required to write a 2500 word essay based on a community physiotherapy program that they either referred a patient to or that was available in the health district where they completed their third placement. The following should be included in the essay:

- Outline of the program
- Referral process
- Inclusion and exclusion criteria
- Financial cost to the patient
- Location/access
- Length of program (if there is one)
- Any other information relevant to the program – team members etc.

Using the literature to outline the benefit for patients to be linked in with community programs post discharge from acute or subacute health care centres to continue their rehabilitation/subacute care. Think outside the box, the program doesn't have to be run by a health care provider it can be any organisation that will assist patients to achieve their goals. Transition Care Programs (TCP), Community Based Rehabilitation Teams (CBRT) will not be excepted. Contact Tanya Palmer to clarify appropriate community programs.
